
Australian Childhood Immunisation Register to the Australian Immunisation Register

- Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR).
- Federal Budget 2015-16 announcements:
 - Expansion of the ACIR to capture information for 'young adults' under the age of 20 years (from 1 January 2016)
 - Expansion of the ACIR to capture information for all individuals regardless of age (September 2016)

Multiple updates, vaccine additions and amendments since.




Childhood immunisation coverage rates: 1 and 5 year olds






Childhood immunisation coverage rates: 2 year olds






Childhood immunisation coverage rates: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children






Childhood immunisation coverage rates: 5 year olds






Coverage rates: Primary Health Networks

- Data from the National HPV Register into the AIR.
- Pharmacy provided vaccinations and the AIR.

- Ensure adult vaccination information is reported to the AIR.
- Ensure correct information is reported to the AIR.
- Bring new providers into the system.
