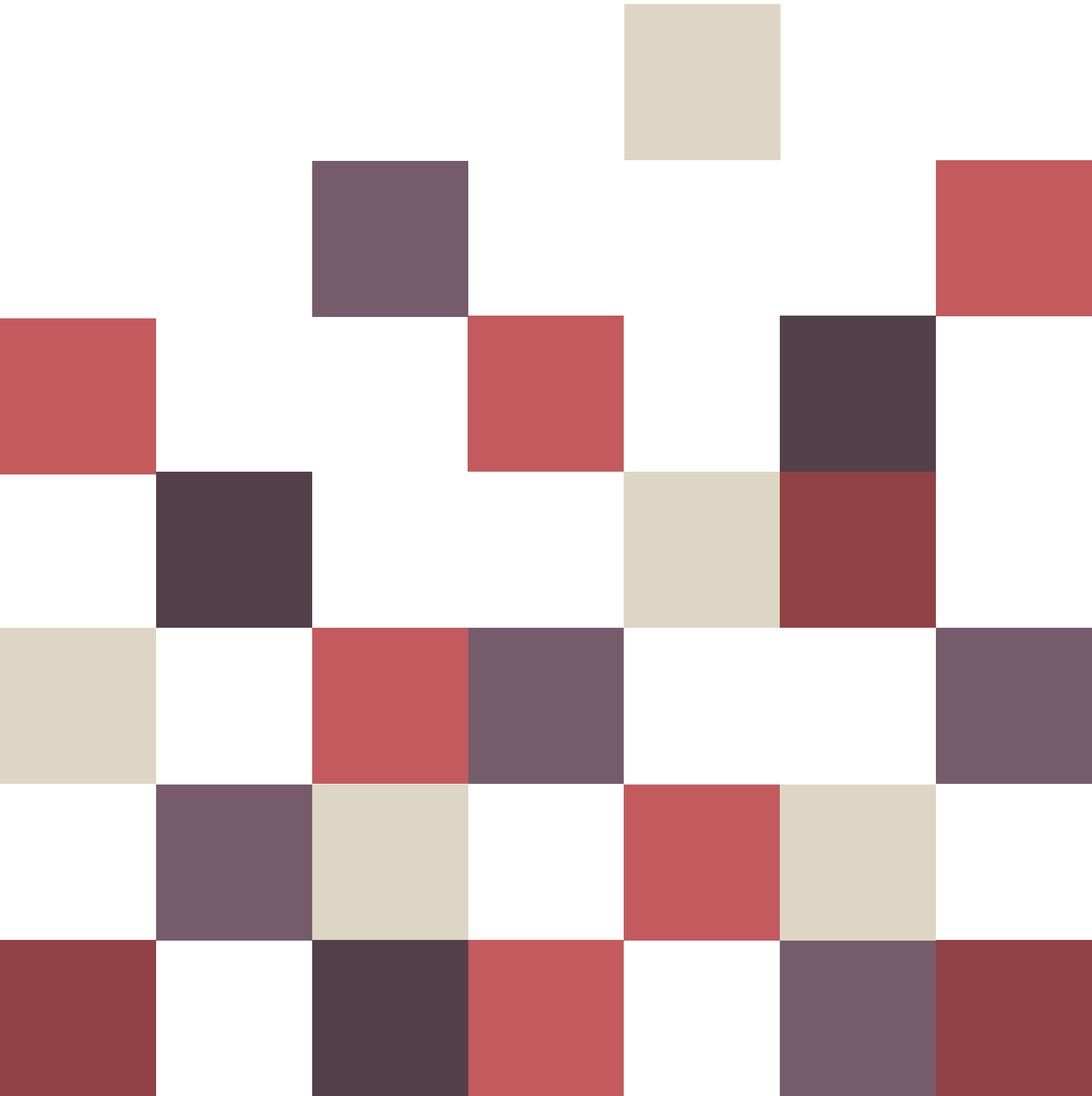

Also retiring at the end of 2023 is Tessa Sampson who has been with the organisation for almost 15 years. Tessa started as my assistant when it became clear I could not do it all on my own, and over time her expertise in medical literature enabled a new level of sophistication in our daily media bulletin.

In the bigger picture, as a nation we have successfully navigated what is hopefully the worst of the pandemic. As a society though, we must remain vigilant and be prepared for the next pandemic, whenever that might be, with the knowledge that the lessons learned from COVID-19 can be applied to the next one. IN MEMORY OF PROF MARY-LOUISE MCLAWS AO



(17 March 1953 – 12 August 2023)

Mary-Louise became a member of the Immunisation Coalition in 2010, and served on the IC's Board of Directors from 2021 until late 2022 when she became incapacitated due to her illness. She became a household name during the COVID-19 pandemic with her regular appearances on television, where she was able to impart her expertise in a manner that was both calming and forthright.

Mary-Louise was an epidemiologist with expertise in hospital infection and infectious diseases control. She was a member of the World Health Organization (WHO) Health Emergencies Program Experts Advisory Panel for Infection Prevention and Control Preparedness, Readiness and Response to COVID-19 and member of the NSW Clinical Excellence Commission COVID Infection Prevention and Control taskforce. She was the Focal Point for the WHO Global Outbreak Alert and Response Network (GOARN) in the School of Population Health.

She also collaborated with Beijing to review the response to the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) outbreak and healthcare worker safety for the Hong Kong SARS designated hospital. She was commissioned by the Commonwealth to review the Pandemic Influenza Infection Control Guidelines for evidence of protection for healthcare workers.

Her research has included performing the seminal Australian survey of healthcare associated infections in 1984 and developing the first surveillance system for healthcare associated infections as a pilot in 1998-2001 for the NSW Health Department.

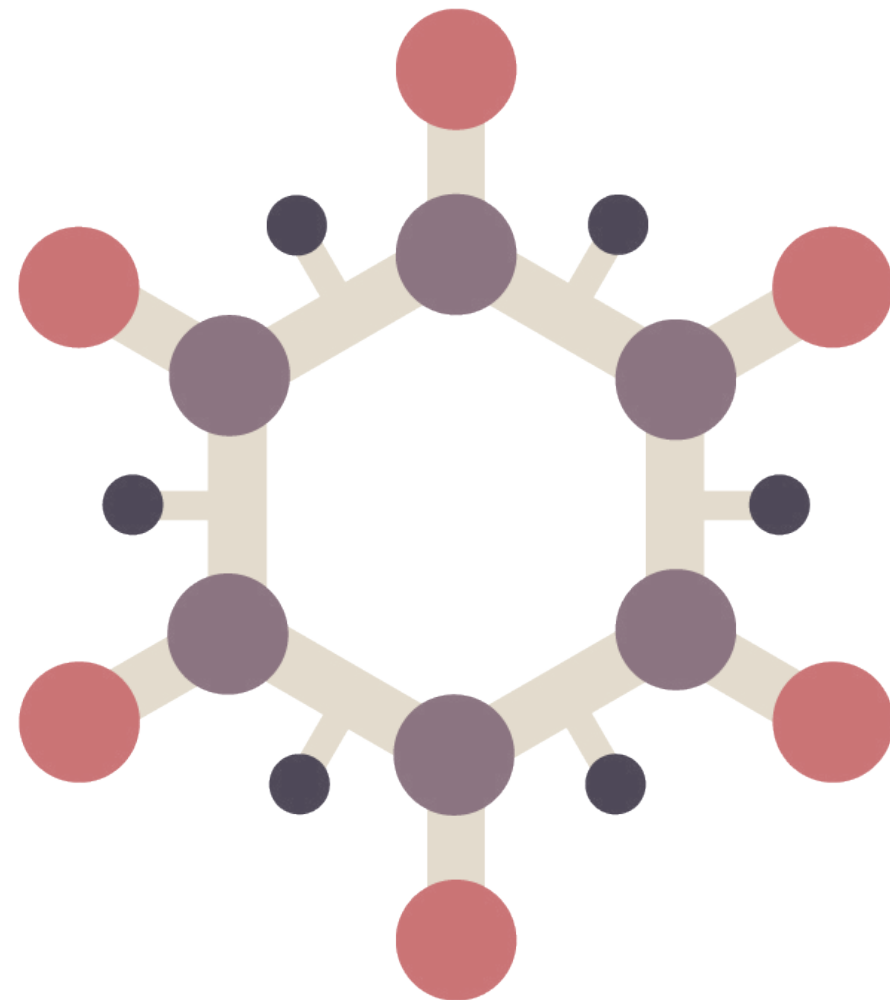
With its aim of protecting all Australians against vaccine preventable diseases, the IC:

VISION, MISSION AND GOVERNANCE

VISION

The Immunisation Coalition will improve the protection of all Australians against infectious diseases through advocacy for immunisation.

MISSION

To create public awareness regarding the importance of immunisation by providing educational materials and communication programs.

To cooperate with key Australian professional bodies, consumer advocacy groups and the Australian, State and Territory Governments in their educational activities focused on immunisation to bring information to Australian healthcare professionals and the public.

To work with consumers, health professionals and organisations with an interest in immunisation, ensuring that the information provided to consumers through our website and other communication channels is current, easily understood and scientifically informed.

GOVERNANCE

The governance of the IC begins with its Board of Directors, and Dr Rod Pearce AM as Chairman. Through its Board of Directors, the IC is able to ensure full control over its activities and published materials.

A Scientific Advisory Committee (chaired by Prof Robert Booy), keeps the Board informed of relevant scientific developments to ensure all of our output is current and accurate.

IC MEMBERS

Members of the IC are residents of Australia and New Zealand who have trained in medicine and or the sciences and have an expertise in immunology, virology, epidemiology, relating to respiratory and other infectious diseases. They provide a pool of expertise that can be drawn on for inclusion in our scientific and education committees, conferences and webinars, and as key opinion leaders in awareness campaigns and media relations. They may also qualify for positions on the board of directors.

Membership is currently for a 5 year fixed term, effective from the date of the Directors' meeting where the membership is approved.

A member of the Immunisation Coalition can attend the Annual General Meeting, and has voting rights. A member may also be invited to attend other meetings of the organisation, and can provide feedback on awareness activities and projects that are being undertaken each year.

A member of the Immunisation Coalition is bound by the Immunisation Coalition's constitution, including liability for no more than \$2 on winding up of the organisation.

DR ROD PEARCE AM
MBBS, FAMA, Immunisation Coalition Chairman

Dr Rod Pearce is a practising grassroots general practitioner (GP) and policy adviser. He was President of the Australian Medical Association (SA) from 1998 to 2000, GP Nationally Elected Representative on the Federal AMA and Chair of the AMA Council of General Practice for 3 terms from 2004 to 2010.

Rod Pearce re-joined the Board of the Immunisation Coalition on 2 February 2020, having previously served for 12 years (since incorporation in 2006). He currently holds positions on the boards of Australian General Practice Network (AGPN), Australian Association of General Practice (AAGP), Australian MedicAlert Foundation (AMAF) and Medical Benevolent Association of South Australia (MBASA). He is a past Chair of the National General Practice Supervisors Association (NGPSA). He is a current member of the Asia Pacific Alliance for the Control of Influenza (APACI) and former Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) member.

In 2008 he was appointed by the then Health Minister, The Hon. Nicola Roxon, to the External Reference Group to develop Australia's National Primary Health Care Strategy for the national health reforms. On Australia Day 2012 Dr Pearce was admitted to the Order of Australia (AM) for service to medicine as a general practitioner, through contributions to national medical organisations, and to education.



PROF ROBERT BOOY
MBBS (Hons), MSc, MD, FRACP, FRCPC

A Board member since 20 April 2012, Prof Booy is a Senior Professorial Fellow at the University of Sydney Children's Hospital Westmead Clinical School. From 2005 to 2019 he held the position of Head of Clinical Research at the National Centre for Immunisation Research and Surveillance (NCIRS) at Westmead Children's Hospital. He is a medical graduate of the University of Queensland (1984) and trained in Paediatrics at the Royal Children's Hospital, Brisbane.

Previously he was Professor/Head of Department of Child Health with the University of London (1999-2005). He was the recipient of a Wellcome training fellowship in genetic epidemiology of severe infection, and of an NHMRC Practitioner Fellowship.

Professor Booy's research interests extend from understanding risk factors for susceptibility to, and severity of, infectious diseases, especially influenza, and invasive disease caused by encapsulated organisms; the clinical, public-health, social and economic burden of these diseases (acutely and over the long-term) and means by which to prevent or control serious infections through vaccines, drugs and non-pharmaceutical measures.

He is recognised as an expert in the COVID and influenza fields, supervising many studies addressing the burden and prevention of respiratory viral disease in children and adults, in the UK, Australia and among Muslim pilgrims to Saudi Arabia.

He has led intervention studies with new vaccines, new vaccine delivery methods and alternate methods for preventing disease and transmission such as antivirals and personal protective equipment like masks.

Most recently his advocacy for meningococcal disease over many years culminated with the Qld government agreeing to provide Meningococcal B vaccine free to children and adolescents in that state. This follows prior success in South Australia when it introduced free Meningococcal B vaccine after many years of advocating for the same.



MS SUZANNE COUTINHO
BSc

Suzanne Coutinho joined the Board on 11 May 2023. She is a senior executive and medical education professional with expertise in the healthcare, publishing, and media sectors.

In an executive capacity she has a two-decade career within healthcare organisations, holding leadership positions with a strong commercial and digital focus.

In her leadership roles with Australian Doctor, MDBriefCase and Inside Practice she has focused on developing new and evolving products and models to deliver to the information and educational needs of healthcare professionals.

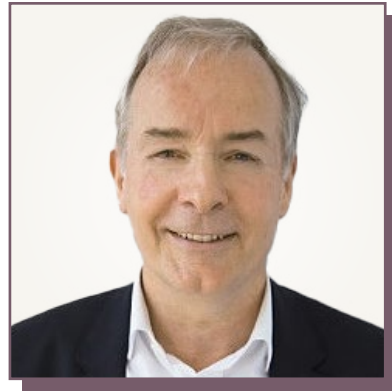
MR NICHOLAS CHUNG

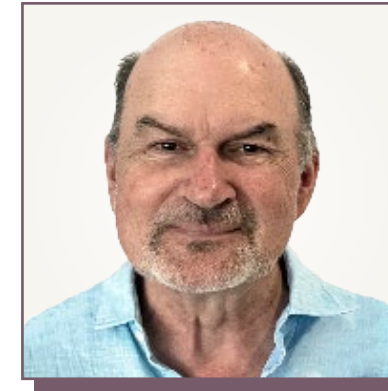

During this time he was a member of VCM committee of WHO responsible for the selection of virus strains for influenza vaccines and involved in the Global Action Plan for influenza vaccines.

Previously he was an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Veterinary Science, University of Sydney, a Principal Scientist and Manager at Australian Water Technologies, Sydney Water and a visiting researcher at the CDC in Atlanta. Since retirement he has worked as a consultant to the WHO Global Influenza Programme and PIP Framework, the Essential Medicines programme, SAGE, and the WHO Steering committee for the review of the IVTM database on influenza viruses and reassortant influenza viruses.

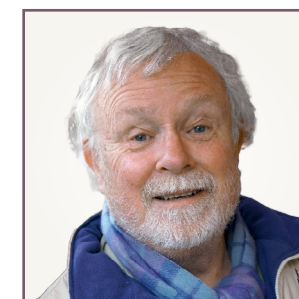

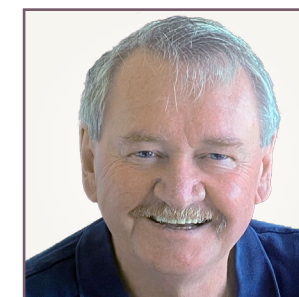

on 31st December 2023.



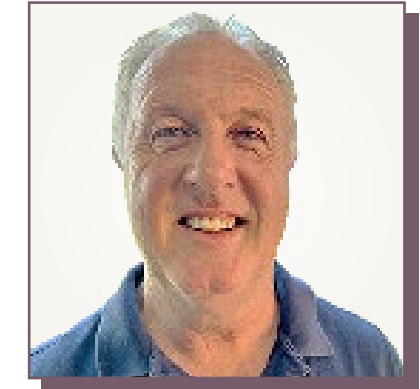
ELIZABETH MILLER

Jayne retired from the IC in October 2023.

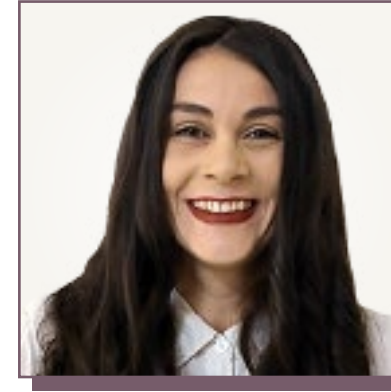

AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

Introduction Raising awareness of influenza was the raison d'être of the Influenza Specialist Group (ISG), with the first awareness campaign of its type held in 1992 as an initiative of Dr Brendan Nelson AO, vice President of the AMA at the time. Dr Alan Hampson OAM built the ISG around the concept, and we have been developing awareness campaigns ever since.

Over the past twelve months, the Immunisation Coalition has been particularly active in its efforts to promote immunisation against vaccine preventable diseases and to educate the public on a variety of health-related topics.

Our campaigns were executed internally and on occasions externally using commercial agencies. Numerous communication channels were utilised in our campaigns, including TV, radio, print and online newspapers, magazines and newsletters.

Our successful campaigns covered COVID-19 boosters, influenza, meningococcal B, pneumococcal disease, travel vaccines, including the "7 diseases in 7 days" campaign (which ran during Immunisation Action Week) that added HPV, pertussis, and shingles,

Complementing our awareness communications, we ran two information Community TV videos on CH 31. We also had Elizabeth Miller speak on community radio which was an effective way to engage a wider national and culturally diverse audience.

A SPECIAL THANK YOU

We thank the IC Directors and Members whose involvement in the campaigns contributed to their success. We have seen an increase in the number of IC followers which continues to grow year-on-year, raising awareness of the importance of vaccinations, as well as reminding people to speak to their GP about vaccine recommendations, and keeping up to date with their immunisations.

COVID-19 BOOSTER CAMPAIGN

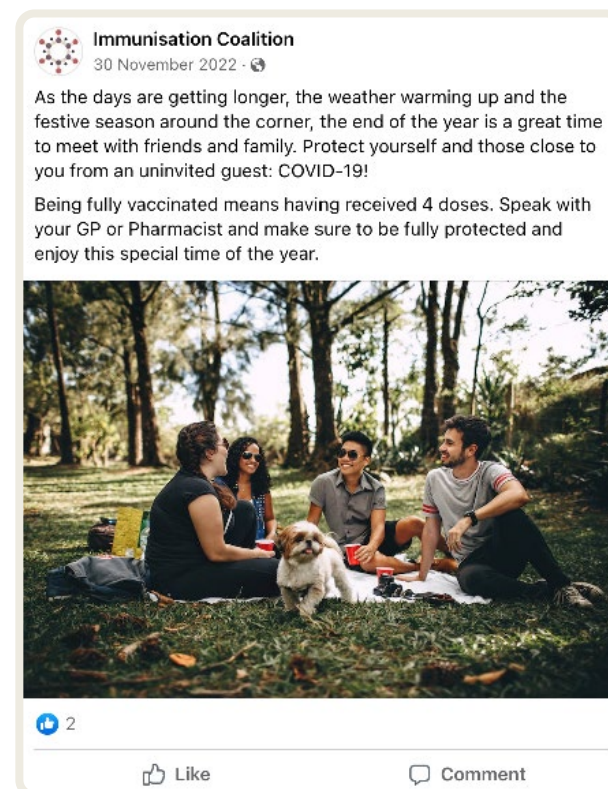
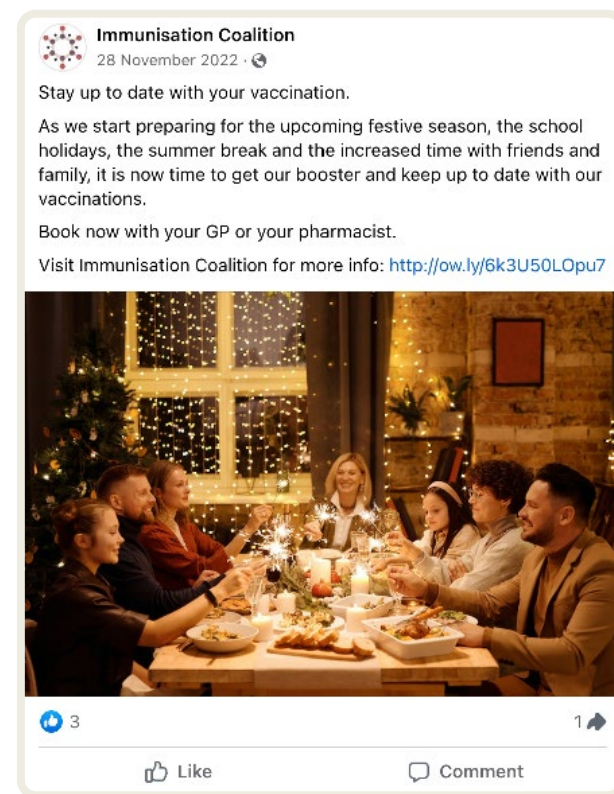
November 2022

The Immunisation Coalition launched a public radio campaign to urge all Australians to get up-to-date with their COVID-19 booster vaccinations without delay and inform them that there is a choice of vaccines.

The campaign targeted complacent and vulnerable people with messages of 'get boosted', and 'it's not too late to vaccinate' leading into Christmas. Interestingly, at this time approximately 5.5 million Australians were overdue for their COVID-19 boosters.

Nationally, in the 16 years and over age group, 27.7% had not had their third booster vaccine, and 57.3% of people aged 30 years and over had not had their fourth booster vaccine.

The key message to consumers was to act now, you have a choice of vaccines. Speak to your GP or pharmacist on what vaccine is best for you today.



ANYWHERE, ANYTIME CAMPAIGN

June – July 2023

'YOU CAN CATCH FLU OR COVID-19 ANYWHERE, ANYTIME'

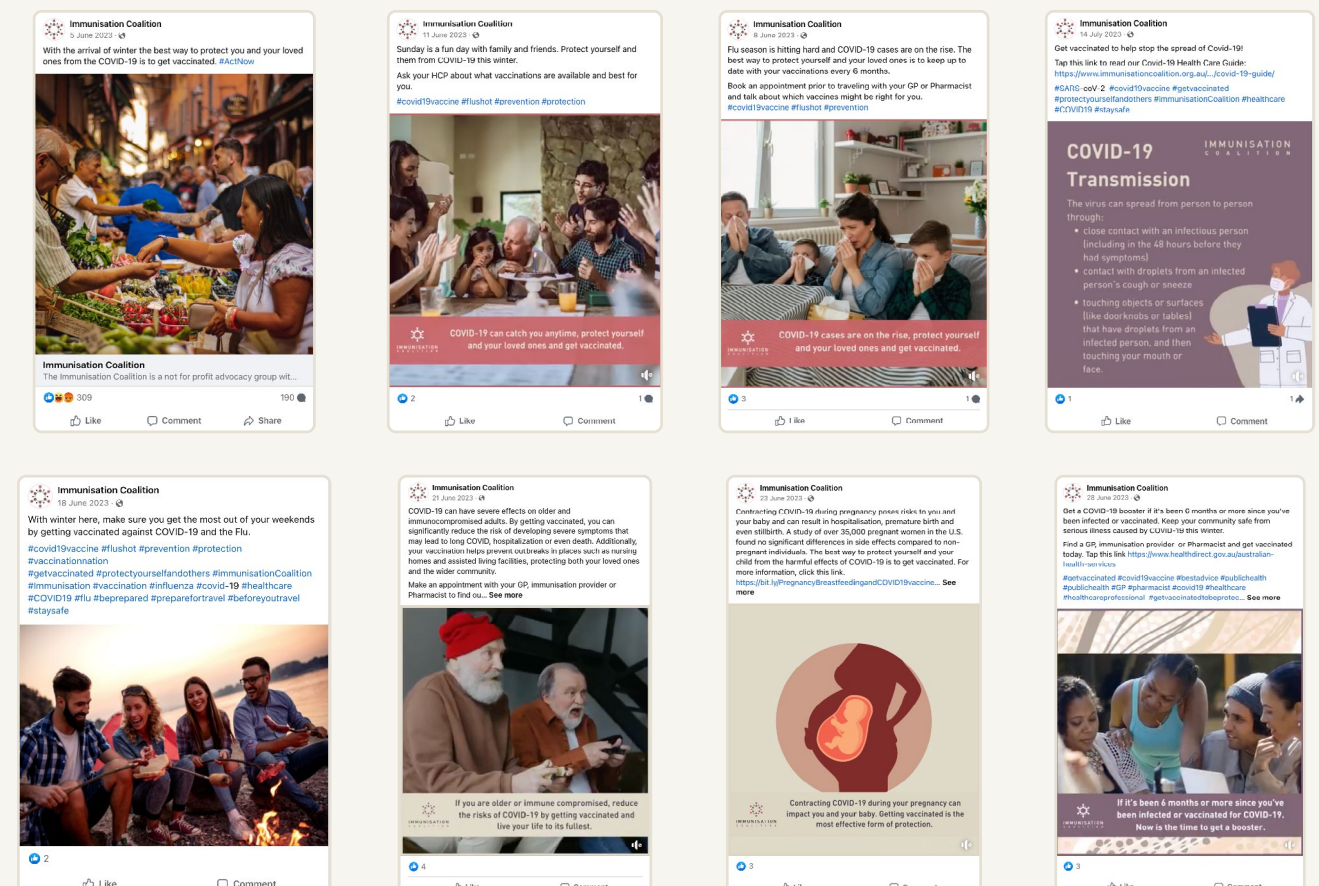
Leading into a new wave and one of the coldest winters on record, COVID-19 infections

began to surge, putting a strain on our hospital systems across Australia: there was a 5.4% increase in hospitalisations at this time which was the catalyst to run this campaign.

Anywhere, Anytime was a consumer social media campaign encouraging all Australians to get up-to-date with their flu and 6-monthly COVID-19 vaccinations. HCPs were encouraged to have a conversation with their patients.

We highlighted upcoming events and gatherings where people may be at risk: School holidays, FIFA Women's World Cup, skiing this winter, or simply catching public transport for work could see COVID-19 and Influenza catching up with you for the ride.

The call-to-action was to speak to your GP, pharmacist or immunisation provider to learn how to best protect yourself and loved ones. The further message was that by doing so, you will contribute to protecting the most vulnerable people in our community.



INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL CAMPAIGN

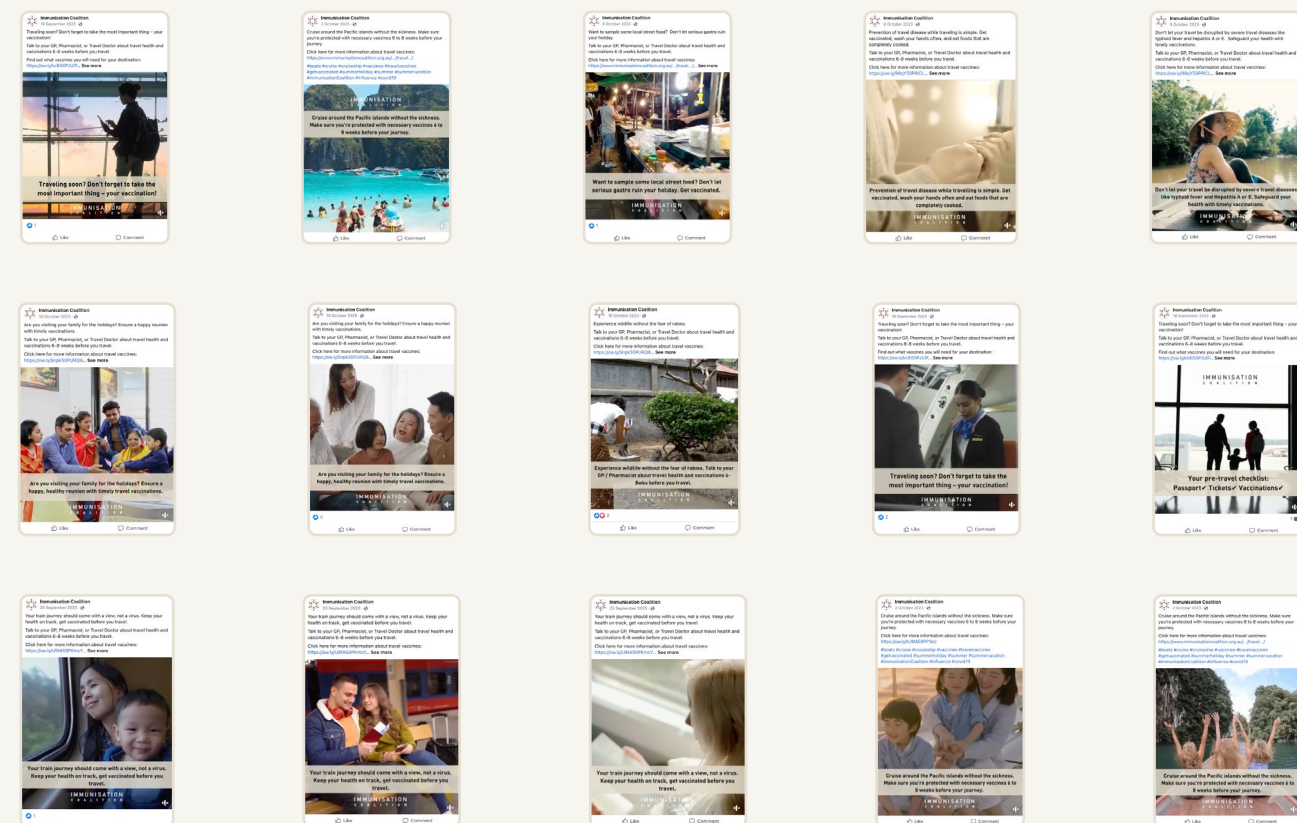
September – October 2023

This media campaign engaged an external agency to provide content via social media, radio, TV and online-print. In addition, the IC produced its own social media communications targeting travellers of all ages highlighting a different travel theme each week. These topics included planes, trains, boats, food & water and family.

With a renewed sense of excitement and freedom, Australians embraced the chance to explore hotspot destinations.

- More than 56% of Australians felt the pandemic has motivated people to travel more than in the past.
- Australians' favourite international holiday locations pose a high risk of illness with almost half of travellers (49%) believing they got sick from something they ate or drank.
- The majority (85%) of Australians do not research health recommendations, and 1 in 3 don't see a GP to discuss vaccination requirements.
- One in three (31%) either do not see a doctor to discuss travel health and vaccination requirements, or leave a consultation too close to their departure to receive full protection.
- Total reach: 19,554, Total engagement: 13,099 overall reach of 32.4M people.
- Rate of engagement increased by 61.27% at the end of a 5 week campaign which reflects considerable growth to our database and followers.

The call-to-action was to encourage travellers to speak to their travel GP about recommended vaccines 6–8 weeks before they head overseas this summer season.



IMMUNISATION ACTION WEEK

24 – 30 April 2023

The Immunisation Action Week (IAW) is a national awareness program that occurs in April of each year to coincide with World Immunisation Week, with a variety of activities for the general public as well as healthcare professionals, and reaches a pinnacle with a national Free Influenza Vaccination Day which took place this year on Friday 28th April.

The program utilises social media to inform and educate Australians on the importance of immunisation against vaccine preventable diseases, with all information provided based on current scientific evidence.

There are 3 major components to Immunisation Action Week:

- Disease Awareness Campaigns (7 diseases in 7 days)
- Free Influenza Vaccination Day
- IC Art Prize

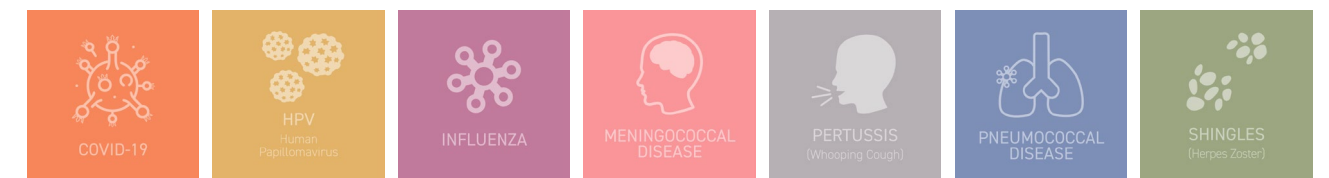

7 DISEASES IN 7 DAYS

Aligned with World Immunisation Week, this was a novel approach introduced in 2022 to highlight 7 of the most common vaccine preventable diseases; namely shingles, HPV, meningococcal disease, pertussis, pneumococcal disease, Covid-19, and influenza. A different disease was promoted every day of the week via our social media platforms (Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram and X and Threads). Targeting HCPs and consumers, the messaging raised awareness of the disease and how vaccinations save lives.

The campaign was very successful so we continued the theme in 2023. An array of digital assets were developed to draw attention to each of the potentially deadly diseases.



FREE INFLUENZA VACCINATION DAY

The Free Influenza Vaccination Day usually takes place on the last Friday in April. This year it was April 28th, and again took place in Melbourne and Sydney with involvement by A/Prof Lou Irving, Director of Respiratory and Sleep Medicine a RMH; Leanne Boase (President, Australian College of Nurse Practitioners); Lord Mayor Sally Capp; and Karen Booth (President, APNA).

For the first time, the event expanded into Brisbane, with support from Lung Foundation Australia and Micah Project, and a press conference involving the QLD Health Minister, Yvette D'Ath; Immunisation Coalition CEO, Kim Sampson; and IC Director, A/Prof Paul Griffin.

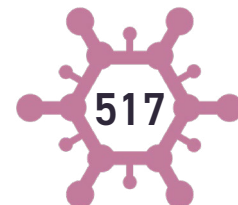

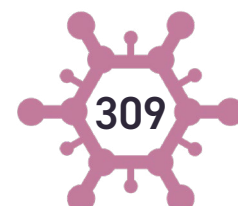

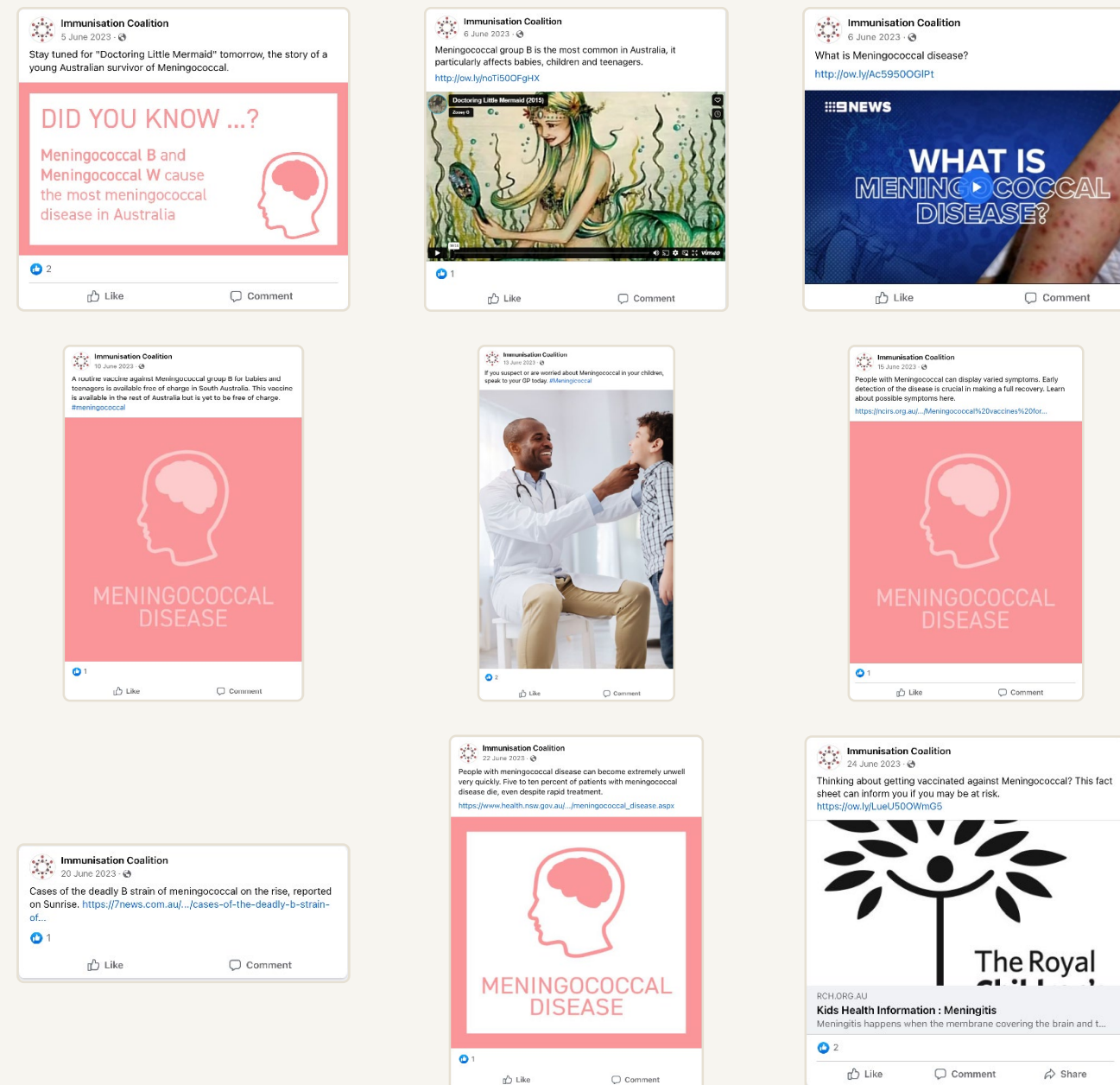

MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

June 2023

Our social media awareness campaign on Meningococcal B disease raised public awareness of this terrible infection that can produce both disability and death. The onset is quick and severe and can be easily prevented through vaccination. South Australia has offered free Meningococcal B vaccine since 2018, so the announcement by the Queensland Government to provide routine vaccinations for Meningococcal B was very good news, particularly as it is a development for which we have advocated for more than 10 years. IC continues to encourage all states to follow SA and Queensland's lead.



COMMUNITY RADIO - GDR-95.7

February – December 2023

Presentations and interviews booked on national community radio discussed how the diseases talked about in the media were relevant and real to listeners. These included: influenza, COVID-19, pneumococcal, meningococcal, respiratory syncytial virus Japanese encephalitis, travel vaccinations and general healthcare infection control precautions.

The call-to-action was to speak to your GP, pharmacist or immunisation provider to discuss and seek advice on keeping up-to-date with all vaccinations, particularly if you're travelling overseas.

The target audience was people aged 50 years and over, reaching approximately 500,000 national listeners. This was an effective way to engage a wide and culturally diverse audience.



COMMUNITY TV

May – September 2023



We ran two television promotions educating viewers on influenza and about the role of the Immunisation Coalition.

The videos ran on free-to-air in peak and off peak times, 7 days a week, for a total of 602 spots.

The Western Australian Government currently provides free flu vaccination throughout the entire state and recently the Queensland Government is also now offering free flu vaccines for the state. Influenza B is surging throughout Australia and it is critical right now, people speak to their GP, Pharmacist or Immunisation Provider to get their Flu vaccine today.

25 JULY

State Government To Reinstate Free Flu Vaccinations For All

From the 1st November 2023, the new zoster vaccine (Shingrix) will be freely available for Australians aged 65 years and over, First Nations and Torres Strait Islanders people 50 years and over, and immunocompromised people 18 years and over at high risk of herpes zoster infection. This follows the advice from the independent medicines experts at the Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (PBAC) and the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI).

31ST OCTOBER

The Importance of Influenza Vaccinations

Today we celebrate International Influenza Day. Influenza seasons are unpredictable and can vary from year to year from very mild (eg 2018) to very severe (eg 2019). While we have antivirals to treat influenza infections, the best prevention method is still vaccination.

Multiple Infections on the Rise. Experts at the Immunisation Coalition are concerned about the rise of infections in the community

A lot of infections are currently on the rise both bacterial and viral. The lifting of COVID-19 restrictions means people are mixing more. Latest figures for Pertussis show a trebling of disease compared with last year. Meningococcal has doubled in 2 years and Streptococcal infection has also risen sharply. The Immunisation Coalition is calling on people to be aware of the symptoms of serious infections, seek medical advice when developing serious symptoms like high fever, shortness of breath or prolonged coughing.

Many infections can be prevented by vaccination but early recognition of serious symptoms can be lifesaving.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

While the Annual Scientific Meeting is about to enter its 25th year, our wider educational activities began as an Influenza slide deck developed in 2014 as a tool to be shared with educators to ensure they had the most up to date and relevant information about influenza. This was updated each year and became the basis for our first influenza webinar, produced in 2017 and presented by Angela Newbound. In the same year we held our inaugural Adult Immunisation Forum, and our Education Program was born.

With the appointment of Andrew Minton as Education Manager at the beginning of 2023, and the introduction of an accredited CPD program, educational activities now represent a major part of the overall Immunisation Coalition activities. Also introduced this year was the Primary Care Infectious Diseases Meeting (PCIDM), our 3rd major annual educational event.

There were 19 individual education activities in 2023, consisting of CPD and non-CPD, sponsored and non-sponsored events. In total, we attracted over 8,000 registrations (over 5,000 participants), averaging 265 participants per event. This is above the Industry standard, a benchmark we use to compare performance KPIs.

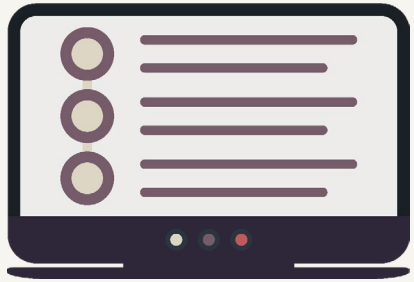
Our database membership has grown significantly, to more than double in the 12 months to December 2023 (over 5000). We will continue to explore opportunities to grow our database membership and promote the IC brand. This includes offering, for the first time, online modular learning programs.

The education outlook remains positive as we continue to offer high quality HCP education covering the needs of all HCPs involved in immunisation and vaccination against infectious diseases. The development of a Learning Management System (LMS) means that we will be more efficient and able to offer registrants a more streamlined service.

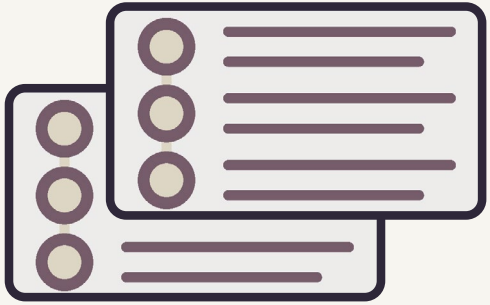

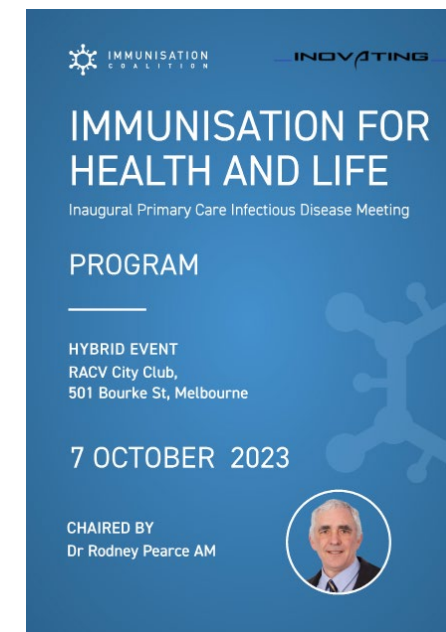
IMMUNISATION FOR HEALTH & LIFE: INAUGURAL PRIMARY CARE INFECTIOUS DISEASE MEETING

7th October

This was the inaugural Primary Care Infectious Diseases Meeting, held at RACV Melbourne and chaired by Dr Rod Pearce AM. As a new event to the IC calendar, this meeting was designed to attract healthcare professionals from the primary care sector, and maximise audience engagement. There were 391 participants (629 registered) with 80 delegates onsite, consisting of mostly GPs.

Supported by the IC GP Education Committee, the program consisted of 8 rapid-fire short presentations, 2 keynote presentations, 2 panel discussions and 6 workshops (4 onsite, 2 online). The workshops consisted of patient case examples to work through and awarded 1.5 Reviewing Performance CPD hours.

Next year will likely be hosted in Sydney with the aim of attracting more GPs and building a greater footprint in preventable infectious disease education. As an inaugural meeting, we were pleased to attract 6 sponsors.

COLLABORATIVE EVENTS

SAC INDUSTRY BRIEFINGS

Past and present members of the SAC are afforded the opportunity of being informed by representatives of the Pharmaceutical Industry about their clinical studies, and progress of their respective vaccine pipelines. The information provided is commercial in confidence, so it is not shared with the public, or those outside of the SAC members. It does however enable the IC to be at the forefront of vaccine development knowledge.

The SAC Industry briefings are usually moderated by Prof Robert Booy in his capacity as chair of the SAC.

ROUNDTABLE MEETINGS

The concept of the round table was developed in 2018, at a time when pharmacists were first given the right to provide influenza vaccination to the private market. A series of meetings were organised aimed at bringing together GPs and pharmacists, along with the pharmaceutical industry, to find common ground, and ultimately improve vaccination coverage rates during the flu season.

In 2021 the roundtable was re-established with the following objectives:

- Bring industry, government, and other related parties together to identify and solve issues that might otherwise impede vaccination rates in Australia.
- Create better outcomes for Australians through a unified approach to influenza vaccination messaging, in the lead up to, and during the annual influenza season, and beyond.

Meeting weekly during the peak season, and monthly in the off season, in the past twelve months we have welcomed numerous pharmaceutical industry representatives, GPs, pharmacists, distributors, and government personnel to the roundtable. Some of the issues covered were influenza vaccination of children under 5, state Government participation in free vaccination programs, and vaccine distribution.

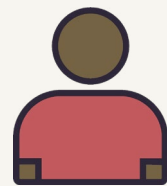

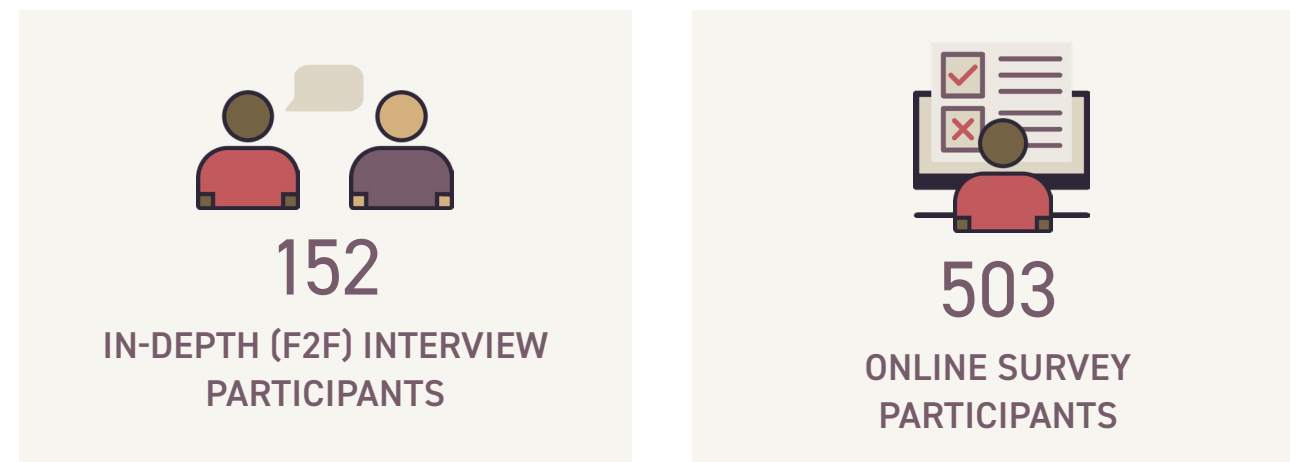
CONSUMER SURVEYS

The Immunisation Coalition began conducting consumer surveys in 2012, as the Influenza Specialist Group. The first of these was about presenteeism - the notion of attending the workplace while unwell, typically with a cold or possibly the flu. In 2013 the IC commenced an annual survey on attitudes towards the seasonal flu shot. This gave us an insight into why people did, or did not, get their annual influenza vaccination.

As time went by, the importance and usefulness of the consumer surveys began to grow, with health professionals, industry representatives and media all drawing on the data provided. The data from several of these surveys has been analysed by the University of Queensland's School of Public Health in preparation for journal publications. There were four surveys conducted in 2023.

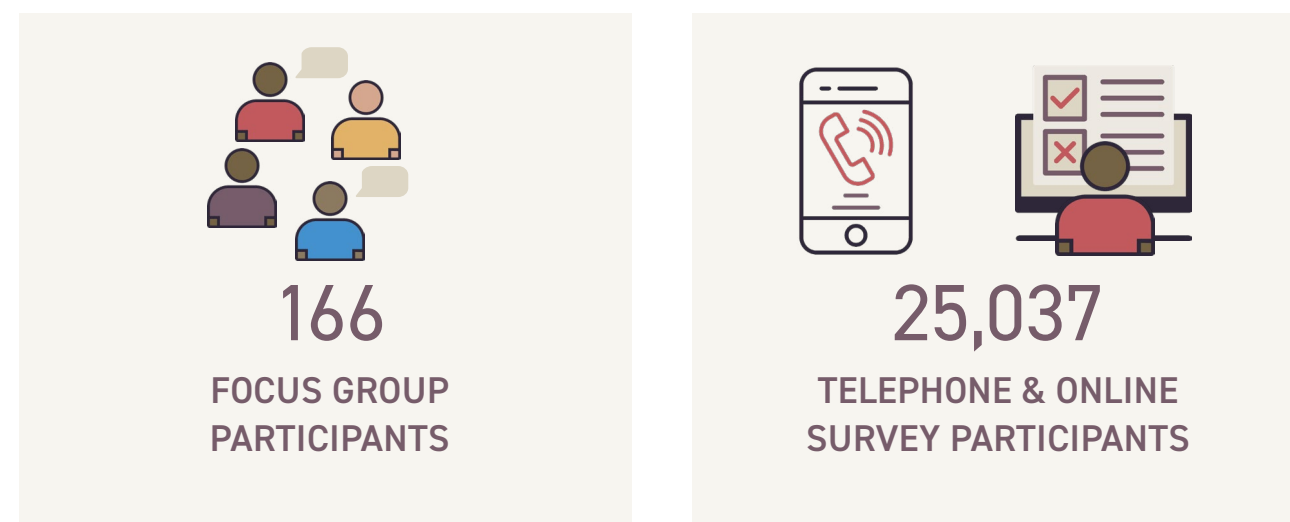
GP ATTITUDES TO ADULT VACCINATION

To understand prescribing behaviour for certain vaccines (representative of General Practitioners throughout Australia, across all States, Territories, metropolitan, regional & rural areas)



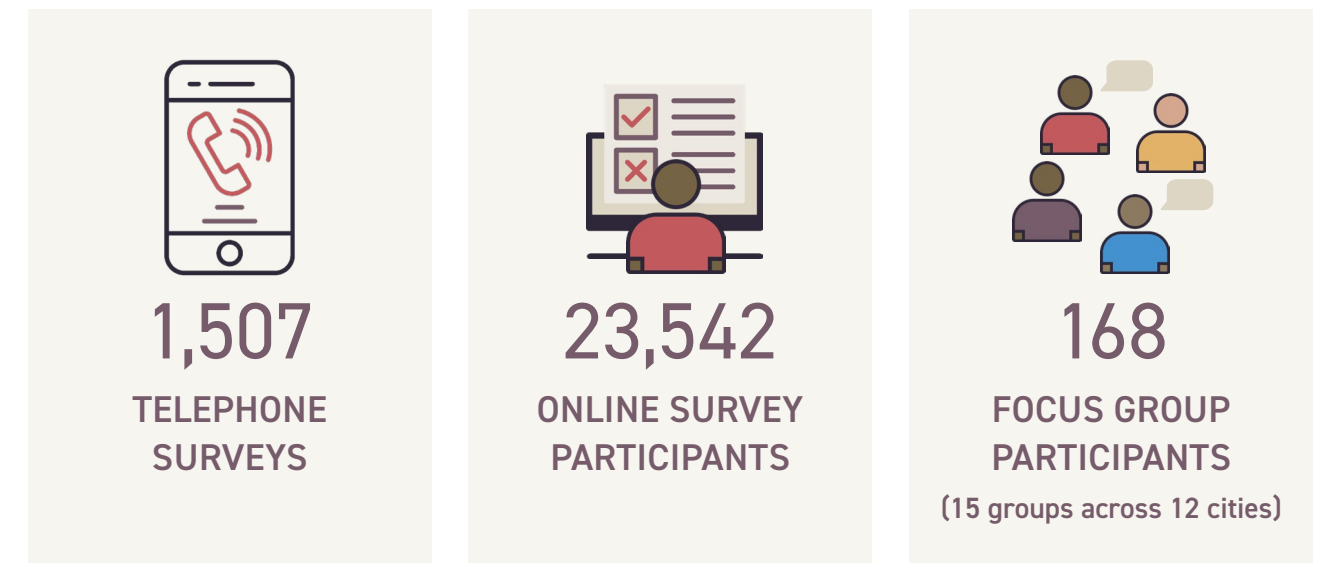
INFLUENZA VACCINATION: CHILDREN UNDER 5

PNEUMOSMART VACCINATION TOOL

The PneumoSmart Vaccination Tool (PVT), was developed in partnership with IC member Angela Newbound. It is designed to simplify the complex National Immunisation Program (NIP) schedule for vaccination against pneumococcal disease.

The PVT plays a crucial role in assisting healthcare professionals in administering the vaccine by providing up-to-date recommendations and adjustments in line with ongoing developments in pneumococcal disease vaccines and changes to the NIP.

Its dynamic nature ensures that it remains a valuable resource to quickly respond to changes in pneumococcal disease vaccination, and the changing digital landscape.

CORICAL



The CoRiCal Risk Calculator was launched in late 2021 by the IC in collaboration with QUT, UoQ, Flinders University and the University of Sydney, as a tool to assist GPs talk to their patients about vaccination against COVID-19.

By comparing average outcomes for people who are vaccinated, unvaccinated, have become infected with COVID-19 or develop side effects, the tool helps with decision making around COVID-19 vaccination.

In early 2023 CoRiCal launched a Children's version of the risk calculator. It is specifically designed to assess the risks and benefits to those aged between 5 and 18 years old.

CoRiCAL will continue to respond to the changing COVID-19 environment. The Immunisation Coalition thanks the many experts who have been involved in the development and ongoing monitoring of this important tool.

NEW INITIATIVES

The Immunisation Coalition is expanding its reach through various online and community initiatives, including educational webinars, communication activities, media releases, awareness campaigns, health promotion events and participation in corporate networking events. OMEGA



OMEGA is designed to inspire high school students to understand science through learning about infectious diseases, vaccines and epidemics. It provides ready-made lessons with a science teacher's guide to educate secondary students about the use of science to end disease. We call it 'infectious science' inspirational and informative. It has trialled in many schools.

For example, in Victoria, a 10 lesson program was introduced at McKinnon Secondary College in Melbourne, where students actively participated. Teachers around Australia continue to download this online program omega.org.au. Teacher and student feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and many more secondary schools around the country are downloading the free program for year 9 or 10 science curriculum in 2024.

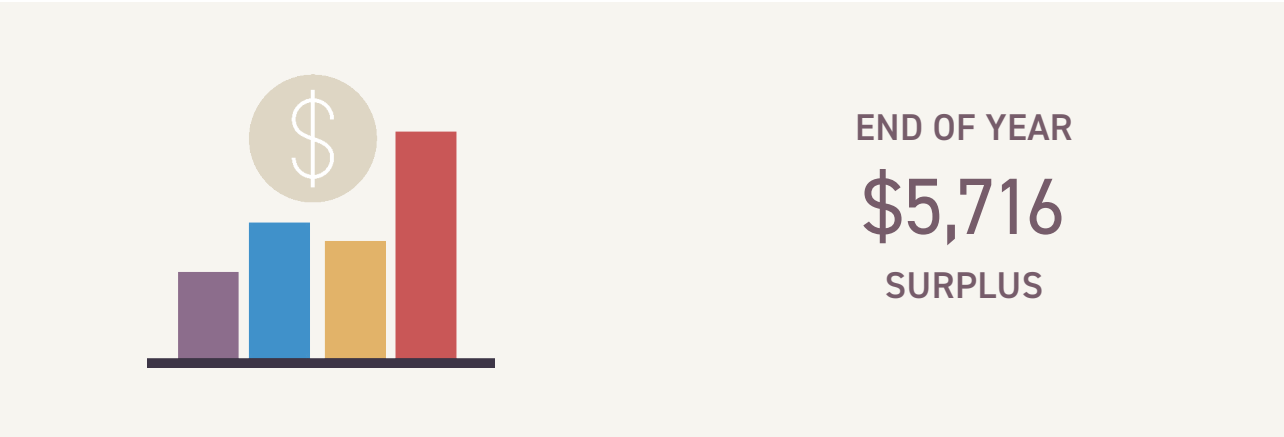

LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

An LMS is an online platform used to store and make accessible teaching materials for account holders. The IC has invested in such a program to host future education activities including, but not limited to, webinars and modular learning programs. This should save a significant amount of time in producing HCP Certificates (for CPD and non-CPD activities/events) and the generation of output reports. A fully functional LMS should be available in early 2024 and will be critical if we are to offer future learning and behavioural change CPD accredited programs.

FINANCIALS

The Immunisation Coalition financials are outlined below for the period 1 November 2022 – 31 October 2023.
